Chairman Bregman began the discussion with events which have recently taken place. He noted that when he was appointed to the NMRC, the NMHA just filed a lawsuit against NMRC. Chairman Bregman stated he looked deeper into the lawsuit and determined, in his opinion, the lawsuit was frivolous. Since then, Chairman Bregman pointed out he has seen a deterioration in the NMHA leadership. Chairman Bregman opined we should be working together to make the horseracing industry better in instead of fighting. However, the Chairman noted the NMHA refuses to be licensed and continues to fight against being regulated. He stated the NMHA had illegally been diverting 1% of purse money. He then noted the NMHA refused to approve a simulcast agreement at SunRay Park which only hurt its own group. The Chairman noted the NMHA attempted to not sign the simulcast agreement for Ruidoso. 		Mr. Gary Mitchell, attorney for NMHA, also made a public comment. He pointed out Chairman Bregman and he have a huge disagreement about this issue. He stated that "every member is licensed". Mr. Mitchell alleged NMHA staff found a "major error" which SunRay Park allegedly made in the gaming money transfer request at issue. He continued to state to Chairman Bregman that his opinions in these matters were wrong. Finally, Mr. Mitchell asked the NMRC not follow through with this action.	
		Ms. Vanessa Alexander also made a comment "hoping that the NMRC recognize the NMHBA"

		Commissioner Smith commented it is a sad day for horseracing in New Mexico. He agreed with Chairman Bregman the NMHA leadership has caused all of this. He said that unfortunately this action needs to be done for the betterment of the racing industry in NM.	
		Chairman Bregman announced the Commission was not ready to announce which group will be recognized as the official horsemen's group at this time. It has, however, been established that it will no longer be the NMHA based on the entire NMRC's votes which just took place.
