However, no response was ever filed by the 8 th or thereafter and no additional time was ever requested by Mr. Blackburn. Almost 2 ½ months later, the Hearing Officer granted the motion to dismiss due to no response ever being received. Further, no objection to the Hearing Officer's recommendation was ever filed pursuant to NMAC 15.2.9.15(E) and (F). AAG Lecocq argued this motion should be granted. Mr. Blackburn was present to rebut AAG Lecocq's arguments. Chairman Bregman stated the Commission definitely has compassion for Mr. Blackburn's arguments, however, the NMRC has been told numerous times it needs to follow its own rules. Commissioner Smith abstained from voting on this matter. AAG Sally Malave pointed out the NMRC rules provide that within 10 days after a Hearing Officer's report is filed, a party of record may file objections to that report. So as far as the argument that there was no clear rule of how long Mr. Blackburn had to object to the Hearing Officer's report, the Commission rules are very clear it is 10 days after the report is filed. Mr. Goncharoff said they are currently working on some measures to improve their numbers of both breeds and the quality of both. Commissioner Sanchez suggested opening all races instead of having breed races to attract horses from other states. Chairman Bregman gave Mr. Dix of Sunland Park the opportunity to share his thoughts regarding this issue. He too believes mixed meets seem to be a big issue in NM. Commissioner Buffington said there needs a real plan to run straight meets. Rick Baugh of Ruidoso Downs suggested a summit to discuss this issue amongst all interested parties. Chairman Bregman suggested a meeting be organized to flush out all these issues and brainstorm ideas. A special meeting should be organized to open this dialog in early January. Don Cook reminded everyone this would be the third time for such a summit. Five years ago, NM was known for being a drug state. In his opinion, NM has horseracing and bush tracks. NM is still considered bush racing until change is made.
